

LSGH opens Nursery classes

The pitter-patter of more little feet will echo through the classrooms of La Salle Green Hills as it opens two (2) sections of Nursery classes, with 25 students in the AM session and 26 for the PM session under the instruction of two senior members of the grade school faculty, Ms. Maria Rizza M. Guillermo and Ms. Joanna Karla N. Bautista. The school embarked on a Nursery Program in response to the growing request from parents and alumni to accommodate 3 ½ -4 year olds and to further the Lasallian mission of providing education for the very young.

Months prior to the June 14 opening, benchmarking and other measures were conducted to ensure a well-crafted nursery program that promotes the child's social, emotional, physical, and cognitive development through organized play, peer interaction, story-telling, and exploratory activities towards confidence and skill-building.

The program advocates the following objectives*:

1. To provide an avenue that will help develop the social, emotional, physical/psychomotor and cognitive skills of the pupil
2. To enhance the 3Rs (reading, writing and arithmetic skills) and life skills of the pupil
3. To prepare the pupil for real school life that will commence in Kindergarten
4. To develop the moral and Christian values of the pupil through the Christian Living program

The curricular offerings of the Nursery Program includes Christian Living and GMRC, Mathematics, Literacy, Music and Art and Penmanship (Writing.)

HS changes gears for new SY

The High School Department began its new schoolyear with the announcement of its first alumnus-Principal, Br. Richie P. Yap FSC, LSGH Batch 95, along with other key personnel assignments and program adjustments.

The department has made modifications in the course offerings in line with the K to 12 program, finishing preparations for the first batch of senior high school program students under the General Education track by SY 2017-18. These changes in the High School program include the intensification of the Robotics and Accounting electives and the introduction of a new course, Basic Trouble-Shooting and Networking.

This was followed by the 4-week summer bridging program attended by 389 Grade 9 students from April 20 to May 15, 2015. Under the guidance of 15 teachers from the high school faculty, the students labored for 17 days learning 3 subjects required for the Junior High School curriculum - Physics, Economics and Advance Algebra.

An equally important development is the shift of Grades 7 and 8 to the High School Department as the first year and second year level equivalent, along with the transfer of 32 Grade School teachers to the High School faculty roster. Mrs. Cristina Nolasco was appointed as the new Assistant Principal for Grades 7-8 while an additional Prefect of Students was also assigned in the person of Mr. Ed De Vera. Also new in the roster of High School administrators designated to supervise the implementation of the academic curriculum is Mrs. Donna Ines, Assistant Principal for Academics.

On the student front, a total of 59 clubs and organizations were opened to the students starting July 1.

ANHS flies high anew

The Adult Night High School forges on a new schoolyear under new leadership, with the entry of Mrs. Agnes C. Alonzo, formerly of the Grade School Department, as their new Principal for SY 2015-2016. The ANHS now boasts of a broader administration, apart from its two coordinators (Academics and TVET-TLE), a new Administrative Affairs Coordinator has been added to their roster in the person of Mr. Roy Daz.

The ANHS has also recently been granted a 5-year PAASCU Re-Accreditation that qualifies them to proceed with a FAAP Level III application. A re-accreditation ascertains that LSGH is a school that provides quality education through its curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular programs.

On the 5-year HS Program front, the department has continued to offer Saturday classes for Grades 9 and 10 students. Three Senior High School advanced subjects are offered on a semestral basis to facilitate the coverage of the required K-12 curriculum while keeping to their 5-year program. The line-up of subjects for first semester include: [Grade 9] Reading and Writing,

Philosophy, Physical Education and [Grade 10] Filipino, Physical Sciences, Media and Information Literacy. For the second semester the following will be offered: [Grade 9] Oral Communication, Personal Development, Earth and Life Sciences and [Grade 10] Filipino, Contemporary Philippine Arts, Physical Education.

At the moment, the department offers 2 out of the 3 Senior High School tracks: Business, Accountancy, Management (BAM) strand for the Academic Track and Technical Vocational Livelihood (Home Ec).

On the TVET side, the unit currently offers 10 courses, with a new course offering, Bookkeeping NC3. Following its TESDA recognition as one of the Accredited Competency Assessment Centers in Manila, the TVET continues to improve its course offerings through its provision for adequate facilities and qualified teachers providing quality education for its students.

The Program for Deaf Learners continues to be implemented under their new Moderator, Ms. Junelyn Domingo.

Mandarin program continues

Following a successful integration into the regular curriculum for Grade 3 in schoolyear 2014-15, the Chinese Language Program expands its offering from Basic Mandarin to Pre-Intermediate Mandarin, this time to include Grade 4 pupils.

The focus of the special foreign language classes is the training of Chinese communicative competencies to form a solid foundation for speaking and reading in Mandarin and the acquisition of proficiency in the language. The school follows the recommended course outline for teaching Chinese to foreigners through a functional and relevant curriculum based on the Youth Chinese Test (YCT).

The past schoolyear saw the development of the Grade 3 pupils' skills in proper pronunciation of Hànyǔ pīnyīn (Chinese phonetic alphabet) and in basic Chinese greetings, essential vocabulary and simple sentences.

The pupils also engaged in the celebration of the Mid-Autumn Festival (Mooncake Festival) and the Spring Festival (Chinese New Year), where they played traditional Chinese games, made Chinese lanterns and learned how to sing Chinese songs.

For this schoolyear, the practice of pīnyīn will be intensified, more vocabulary words will be taught, and other basic sentences will be introduced as the Grade 4 pupils are set to take YCT 1 in November 2015 and YCT 2 by March 2016, while the Grade 3 pupils take their YCT 1 by March 2016 as well. The celebration of Chinese festivals and the teaching of Chinese culture will ensue as alternative classroom activities.

The Chinese Language Program is just one of the school's many endeavors to strengthen its commitment to producing better-equipped internationally competitive Lasallians ready to cope with the demands of

globalization, with the knowledge of the Chinese language as a potent tool.

CLP is under the supervision of Mrs. Indrie Ronda, Executive Assistant to the President and managed by Miss Johanna Batolos, CENTRO Researcher, together with Mr. Jigger Rayel, HRD Trainor. Handling concerns for the Grade School Department as Mandarin Coordinator is Mrs. Lisa Datuin, with the support of Gr. 2-4 Assistant Principal, Mr. Eugene Young and GS Principal, Mr. Jose Ramelle Javier.

Two Chinese teachers join us from Chinese organization Hànbàn/Confucius Institute in partnership with the Angeles University Foundation. Méng Qīngxiá (Miss Queenie) from Nanjing Province and Dù Wēi (Miss Rachel) from Yunnan Province take over Grade 4 and Grade 3 respectively.

La Salle Green Hills has brought the PEARL Program to new heights this schoolyear as it embraces the multiplatform approach. From the initial Samsung 8.9 and 10.1 tablets, current Grades 3, 6 and 9 pupils may now use other devices conforming to specifications required by the school. These include devices running on Apple IOS version 8.1, Microsoft Windows version 8, the Android-Jellybean/KitKat/Lollipop or the Google Chrome OS.

This is also to address the growing plethora of applications and devices available online that would allow for diverse knowledge, the development of varied levels of familiarity, and expertise in the manipulation of such.

Likewise, the multiplatform approach will eventually pave the way for the school to gain international recognition and certification from Microsoft and Google.
